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1. Summary

- This Basel III Pillar 3 Report for Arab Bank for Investment and Foreign Trade ("Al Masraf" or "the bank") has been prepared in accordance with the public/ market disclosure requirements and guidelines in respect of Pillar 3 of Basel III, as prescribed by the Central Bank of the UAE (CBUAE) and other clarifications received from time to time along with the Pillar 3 Formal Disclosure Policy of the Bank.
- The purpose of this report is to inform market participants of the key components, scope and effectiveness of the Bank's risk measurement processes, risk profile and capital adequacy. This is accomplished by providing consistent and understandable disclosure of the Bank's risk profile in a manner that enhances comparability with other institutions.
- The Bank has adopted the Standardized Approach for Credit Risk, and Market Risk and the Basic Indicator Approach for determining the capital requirements for Operational Risk.
- This Pillar 3 Report provides details on the Bank's risk weighted assets, which form the basis for the calculation of the capital requirement, leverage ratio and liquidity.
- In accordance with the minimum capital requirement calculation methodology as prescribed under Basel III, the Bank's capital adequacy as at 31st March 2023 and a comparison thereof with the figures as of 31st December 2022 and 30th September 2022 is as follows:

- As of 31st March 2023, the Banks total Risk Weighted Assets (RWAs) amounted to AED 18,132 million, which comprised of 92.2% Credit Risk; 0.02% Market Risk and 7.78% Operational Risk.

The Risk Weighted Assets (RWA) declined during the period on the back of some loan repayments and as the Bank continued to selectively book new business. The RWAs reduced to AED 18,132 million as at 31 March 2023 as compared to AED 18,399 million as at 31 December 2022 and AED 19,066 million as at 30 September 2022.

Leverage ratio dropped marginally to 15.2% as at 31 March 2023 compared to 15.4% as at December 2022 due to an increase in the leverage ratio exposure and a marginal drop in the Tier 1 Capital due to a reduction in the partial add back of ECL under the IFRS transitional arrangements.

The ELAR and ASRR at 17.07% and 86.61% improved as compared to the 31 December 2022 as the Bank continued to manage its balance sheet and funding position. The ratios were above the minimum limits set by Central Bank of UAE.

The Bank is applying the transitional adjustment for the ECL amount in line with the requirements under Notice No. CBUAE/BSD/N/2020/2016 – "Regulation Regarding Accounting provisions and Capital Requirements – Transitional Arrangements" issued by CBUAE.

Credit risk weighted assets decreased to AED 16,699 million as at March 2023 from AED 16,935 million as at December 2022 mainly on the back of some loan repayments. However, overall total assets increased due to increase in cash and balances with Central Bank of UAE during the period.

There was a drop in Market risk weighted assets during the period as compared to 31 December 2022 on the back of reduced underlying exposures.
